Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Drill – Saturday, Nov. 15, 2014

- What:** Semi-annual Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Drill covering the San Ramon Valley. Pairs of scouts will be stationed in parts of our community and will read emergency scenarios to mobile Ham Radio Operators, who will prioritize the information and radio in the most important situations to our EOC (Emergency Operations Center). Parent drivers will need to shuttle scouts and will be asked to drive Ham Radio Operators through the neighborhoods of Alamo.
- When:** Saturday, November 15; 9:00-11:00 a.m. (2 hours) OR 9:00- 1:00 (4 hours) if participating in the bonus – a free pizza lunch and tour of the fire station.
- Where:** Meet outside Peet’s Coffee at Alamo Plaza Shopping Center, 215 Alamo Plaza, Suite E, Alamo. The CERT drill will be in the Alamo neighborhoods.
- Cost:** \$0 (includes free pizza lunch)
- Return:** Scouts may be picked up after the drill at 11:00 a.m. at the Alamo Plaza OR stay on for a BONUS – a lunch and a tour of Fire Station #36 near Blackhawk east gate. Scouts will be dropped off at their homes between 1:00-1:30 p.m.
- Uniform:** Class A
- Why:** (1) Serve your community; (2) Fulfill requirement # 7 for the Eagle-required Emergency Preparation Merit Badge; (3) Learn more about the Emergency Response and Multi-agency Operations; (4) See CERT procedures in action; (5) Have fun!!!
- BONUS:** As a “thank you” at 12 noon our Fire Department / CERT Team will give a free pizza lunch and special tour of Fire Station #36 at 2100 Lusitano St. in Danville, CA (near Blackhawk East Gate). 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INFORMED CONSENT, RELEASE AND PERMISSION TO TREAT

If this activity involves archery or firearms, I hereby give express consent for a qualified range instructor to furnish BSA-approved archery or firearm equipment to the participant for the purpose of instruction in the safe handling and use of such equipment and related activities at designated ranges.

I hereby give permission for the adult leaders to give over-the-counter (OTC) medicines as needed (e.g. Aleve for headache, fever, inflammation, pain; Benadryl for allergic reactions, nasal allergies, hives and itching; Lomotil for diarrhea; etc.) In case of emergency involving my child, I understand every effort will be made to contact me. In the event I cannot be reached, I hereby give my permission to the medical provider selected by the adult leader in charge to secure proper treatment, including hospitalization, anesthesia, surgery, or injections of medication for my child. Medical providers are authorized to disclose to the adult in charge examination findings, test results, and treatment provided for purposes of medical evaluation of the participant, follow-up and communication with the participant's parents or guardian, and/or determination of the participant's ability to continue in the program activities. (All reasonable measures will be taken to safeguard the health and safety of the Troop's members.)
