New Troop 805 Tents!

As discussed in the last Parent meeting, our current tents were in need of replacement. The ASM's created a 4 person tent task team to research & seek out the best tent value for our Troop. We brought several models to a recent Troop meeting and all decided to purchase the Taurus 3 Outfitter Tent.

The Taurus 3 Outfitter tent is a high quality three man tent that has many features that make it an ideal Scout tent. It is a 3-season tent made of an all nylon tent body (most tents now are made of polyester). It has clips to attach to the poles instead of sleeves you pass the poles through. This prevents a lot of wicking when the tent body isn't touching the fly due to the way the poles go trough the tent pole sleeves. The tent fly goes all the way down to protect from wind blowing the water through the wall seams. It has heavy duty BIG Jumbo zippers (#10) that are easy to open and close. It has excellent ventilation capabilities.

The Taurus 3 is light enough (9lb, 8 oz) so a small 12 year old boy won't be strained by having it added to his backpack on a hike. It features strong aluminum tent

poles that won't allow the tent to collapse during the wind and rain. The Taurus 3 Outfitter tent has only two poles, which makes for very easy setup! The bottom of the tent is extra durable. It is made of heavy duty nylon, which is twice the weight of normal nylon floor material and is shaped like a tub so that there are no seams touching the ground. It has two doors & two vestibules that close up so they can leave dirty shoes and other gear outside their tent safe from weather. Best of all, we got an excellent price & a great value...a Scout has to be thrifty!

Our goal is to inspect our present tents & slowly phase them out depending on their conditions. As we roll out the new tents, be sure that your Scouts take extra care of them.



September 15th Parent meeting

ASM & Webmaster Stella Yu went thru handouts on how to upload pictures to the Troop website smugmug account. Parents were encouraged to take pictures of the Scout events & upload pics/videos to the site. no need to shrink the size, full resolution is okay as we have unlimited space. ASM & Troop Quartermaster Scott Evans talked about the Troop equipment. He emphasized that the equipment needs to be properly cleaned & returned the following Tuesday after the outing. Unfortunately we are not getting the tents & equipment properly cleaned when they are being returned. He also mentioned that we need 3-4 parent volunteers to help clean out & organize the storage shed. Please contact him if you can help out.

T805 Committee Chair Ed Laubach went over the Troop 805 growth strategy. In order to provide a nurturing and exciting boy scout program to our youth membership, we managed the growth of T805 by proactively maintaining a ideal member population of 80 scouts (+- 5%). Presently we have 80 Scouts. Two Scouts are aging out (turning 18) by the end of the year, so our numbers will be 78 in December 2015. In order

to maintain an age continuity, it is necessary to update our 2015-16 scout growth strategy annually so that we maintain an ideal member population of scouts.

T805 Committee Chair Ed Laubach announced that the T805_rechartering paperwork will be given out at the 10/06/15 COH. We need a count of returning scouts to get better sense of how many new scouts to accept. Presently we are estimating we will have an incoming Patrol of 8 scouts in February, depending on how many returning scouts we have.

T805 Committee Chair Ed Laubach reminded all the parents that Scouts & adults may have money available in their scout account (money earned from participating in events like popcorn fundraiser. In each Scouts registration packet, it lists how much money is available in their Scout accounts. We encourage families to use these funds toward registration fees, or other big ticket outing costs like Summer Camp or High Adventure Camp. We will also contact those who have a substantial amount prior to Summer Camp. You can also Contact Ed at cc@troop805.org if you would like to know how much you have in your account

T805 Committee Chair Ed Laubach reached out to parent for help with certain outings throughout the year. We need volunteers to help out with the hike on this weekend for the Mt. Diablo overnight outing. Parents can also help out during the July 4th parade, Kiwanis Service project & School Service project. T805 Committee Chair Ed Laubach also mentioned that there are still some adult & scout openings for Northern Tier high adventure outing in Summer 2016 (4th year+ - Goodman or above). Nov 10th Parent meeting

T805 ASM Dave Colello discussed the current state of the Troop equipment & tents. Our current tents are getting old & we need new tents. We will target getting 25-30 new tents depending on their size & cost. The proposal to reallocate the budget to allow for \$3800 for additional equipment for approved by the parent committee. We will phase out the old grey/green 3 season tents. They are in various conditions, so will have a "tent party" to inspect what we have in place now. We'll have a meet & greet...invite all families & have a cookout breakfast or lunch...parents can meet Troop leaders, etc...

We will have Patrol equipment inventory inspections to see what we have in place now...each Patrol to bring in their Patrol boxes, red kits, green kits & cooler for inspection to see what needs replacing, etc...

during January Troop meetings. We will inventory during the regularly schedule Troop meeting time, as coming early does not work.

T805 Treasurer Wayne Leong reviewed the reallocated budget & income/outflow estimates.

T805 ASM Stella Lei went thru the Scouting for Food plans & stressed that we needed more adult & scout volunteers as we have a bigger area to cover this year.

T805 ASM Dave Colello went over the Summer Camp 2016 details. We are going to Camp Wente, 3.5 hrs away, north of Willits, from 6/26/16 to 7/2/16. Cost is \$450 + transportation. Scoutmaster Ray Chan is in charge this upcoming year. Further details are on the T805 website.

T805 ASM John Marshall went over the new Scout recruiting. We will have one new incoming 5th grade patrol of 8 Scouts. Siblings will have priority, the others will enter a lottery.

T805 SM Ray Chan reported on the state of the Troop. New boy leadership will start 12/01/15. Jacob L is the incoming SPL. We will have an ILST (Intro to Leadership Scout Training) this Friday for all the Patrol leaders & other leadership positions. SM Ray Chan also went over some of the new 2016 Rank requirement changes that are spelled out in the new Scout handbook.

For 2016, we are assigning specific scouts to outings earlier to all more time for them to plan.

The boys selected a new Troop class B Tshirt at today's troop meeting. We are also looking at sweatshirt options. Elizabeth Gary is our Troop apparel coordinator & new orders will be available ~February.

We are looking for adult leaders, uniformed & non-uniformed for coordination type responsibilities. Adult quartermaster ASM Scott Evans is stepping down from his QM position & we are looking for a new one. It can be split into a multiple person job. We need adults to coach the boys to take care of the equipment & items in the patrol boxes. We need adult help with the Patrol equipment inspections. Please contact Ray Chan if you can help out.


