# Sunol Beginner Backpacking



On April 16<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup>, we have a great backpacking trip through the green, wildflower covered hills of Sunol. We'll check out Alameda County's largest stream, Alameda Creek, and we'll pitch our backpacking tents at Stars Rest Campsite with views of Mission Peak. We'll also try different backpacking foods and water purification methods.

This trip is open to 2nd year scouts and above (Mutant Narwhales, Cobras and above), and is for first time backpackers and geared as an introductory backpack outing.

<u>Permission slips</u> and payment are due Mar  $22^{nd}$ , when we will do initial planning and discuss equipment.

The scouts will have a backpack check on April 12<sup>th</sup>, which is the last troop meeting before the outing. If you cannot make that meeting, you may contact Mrs. Kim or Mr. Benveniste to make a special appointment for a backpack check. At the backpack check, we will make sure your backpack fits you properly, that you have everything you need, and that you don't have anything you don't need. We'll also divide the food and tent equipment.

Experienced backpackers are invited to go on a very challenging 20-mile two-day backpack from Sunol Regional Park through the beautiful Ohlone Wilderness to Del Valle Regional Park. The outing will take place April 16-17. Day 1 will involve approximately 4.000 vertical feet of climbing over 10 miles, in about 7 hours of hiking. Day 2 is about as much descending over another 10 miles. This strenuous intermediate-level backpack is open to scouts with significant troop backpacking experience.

# Lions, a New Pilot Program for Kindergarten Boys, to Begin This Fall



Lions, a new Boy Scouts of America pilot program for kindergarten boys, will begin in our Mt. Diablo Silverado Council this fall.

Why go younger? Research shows that a child's development accelerates at age 4 and 5 — about the time these youngsters begin their formal education in kindergarten. That's also the time when families start looking for after-school activities for their children. While 5-year-olds could join a soccer team or karate studio, they couldn't yet join Scouting. That's about to change in pilot councils across the country. Parents will welcome a program that introduces Scouting concepts and values to 5-year-olds in a fun, age-appropriate way.

The kindergarten-age boys themselves will enjoy exploring the world around them with friends. Lions promises to expand imaginations, spark creativity and amplify fun.

At the end of the Lion year, boys will graduate to Tiger and advance through Cub Scouting. Lions will be piloted in select councils across the country including our very own Mt. Diablo Silverado Council.

Participating councils will share feedback with teams of volunteers and professionals for further study. This is just the beginning of an exciting program sure to grow Scouting.

# Educational Series: Eagle Scout Trivia...March 2016

# What was the average age of 2015 Eagle Scouts?



Eagle Scouts are getting older. In 1949, the average age of Eagle Scouts was 14.6 years. In 2015, that number was 17.34 years old.

There are two factors at play here. For starters, young men are staying in Scouting longer, meaning they're enjoying the program for a longer amount of time and not feeling the rush to earn Eagle until they see their 18th birthday on the horizon.

But also there are more pulls on their time — school, sports, church, friends, etc. — meaning more to do in the same amount of time.

That average Eagle Scout age has been pretty consistent in recent years:

2009	17.32
2010	17.24
2011	17.32
2012	17.23
2013	17.24
2014	17.31
2015	17.34

# Which state had the most Eagle Scouts in 2015?

Once again, Utah takes the crown. No state produced more Eagle Scouts in 2015 than Utah. Thanks in large part to the strong support Scouting receives from the LDS church there, 5,765 young men became Eagle Scouts in Utah in 2015.

Utah is No. 1 on the list for at least the seventh year in a row. That's every year since 2009 — the first year for which detailed Eagle Scout statistics were made available.

California, Texas, Pennsylvania and North Carolina round out the top 5. Here are the top 10 states:
