11:00am Service Project #2: Help remove trash receptacles from parade route after the parade – Meet at the beginning of the parade route (Railroad x Love)

12:00pm Lunch sponsored by the Kiwanis Club at Pete's Brass Rail

Cost: FREE! Includes hot breakfast and/or lunch!

Uniform: Full Class A

INFORMED CONSENT, RELEASE AND PERMISSION TO TREAT

I release the Boy Scouts of America, the local council, the activity coordinators, and all employees, volunteers, participants, related parties, or other organizations associated with the activity from any and all claims or liability arising out of this participation.

I hereby give permission for the adult leaders to give over-the-counter (OTC) medicines as needed (e.g. Aleve for headache, fever, inflammation, pain; Benadryl for allergic reactions, nasal allergies, hives and itching; Lomotil for diarrhea; etc.) In case of emergency involving my child, I understand every effort will be made to contact me. In the event I cannot be reached, I hereby give my permission to the medical provider selected by the adult leader in charge to secure proper treatment, including hospitalization, anesthesia, surgery, or injections of medication for my child. Medical providers are authorized to disclose to the adult in charge examination findings, test results, and treatment provided for purposes of medical evaluation of the participant, follow-up and communication with the participant's parents or guardian, and/or determination of the participant's ability to continue in the program activities. (All reasonable measures will be taken to safeguard the health and safety of the Troop's members.)
